

New Visitor Restrictions – March 24, 2020

As the number of COVID-19 (coronavirus) cases increases, Marianjoy Rehabilitation Hospital, part of Northwestern Medicine, is committed to protecting the safety of all patients, families and staff. For the continued safety of our patients and the community, we have implemented a temporary no visitor policy for all inpatient rehabilitation units.

Admissions

Family members may participate virtually in the admission process. We encourage families to plan ahead to connect electronically with their loved ones, and will provide support to do so if needed.

Discharge

Prior to discharge, family members and/or caregivers may be invited to participate in a virtual family education visit to discuss the patient's home management plan and answer any questions that you have. In some instances, we will allow one family member over the age of 18 to participate in discharge training if determined necessary by the treatment team and approved by the patient's attending physician.

Pediatric Patients

We will allow medically necessary visits to pediatric patients. One designated family member will be allowed to stay with our pediatric patients.

Anyone allowed to visit must do the following:

- Wear a mask while in our facility.
- Clean hands upon entry, after touching surfaces and before exiting our facility.
- Refrain from physical contact and remain 6 feet apart from their loved one.

Visitors who will be attending medically necessary visits with their loved ones will continue to be screened for illness and have their temperature taken before being allowed to visit. Patients are restricted from visiting the cafeteria or having visitors in other common areas or grounds of the hospital.

Please familiarize yourself with the educational materials available at the reception desk.
